

(diverging application by Member States)


European Commission has to push Member States to effectively transpose the Safety & Interoperability directives








Cross Auditing of NSAs




ERA's structure

Intermediate Step 2015






ERA structure for APS and Safety Certificate only




National Authorities will still act as today for other activities than APS and Safety Certificates








ERA = one-stop shop for <u>APS for vehicle in more than 1</u> <u>member state</u>





ERA workflow for APS – ERA as the single issuing authority for APS






Option 2 includes 1 or more than 1 MS








ERA = single issuing authority for Safety Certification




ERA = Appeal Body






Appeal body <u>in disputes</u> about vehicle authorisation and/or safety certificates

ERA empowered to **identify the unnecessary and** superfluous national rules and request their removal


- ERA will make recommendations/guidelines for Member States how to clean up their national rules
- ERA, when alerted by the Sector, will analyse the national technical rules identified as inappropriate in the National Reference Documents
- All National Technical Rules not duly justified by specific cases or open points should be removed
- ERA should systematically analyse any new national technical rules of the National Reference Documents and enforce their removal, when inappropriate




